Here at Wild Wish Farm, the wildest wish (a field full of colorfull horses), of a horse-crazy, suburban girl, her long white-blond ponytail bouncing as she rode her pretend barrel horse, has come true with the help of her Lord.

You will see spotted mares quietly grazing while their colorful foals play peek-a-boo under their dams bellies. Here, amongst his "Girls", Mr. (Cedar Ridge Spot #305895) is content and proud. So am I.

On the following pages, you will meet the "Girls", their foals and see their bloodlines and production records. I only sell foals, once a mare proves herself, she is here to stay. Outside breedings to Mr. are available ONLY to Leopard or leopard-bred mares, \$500.00, LCPG.

Wild Wish Farm Policy is to sell colts at a gelding price, although some outstanding colts can be bought uncut for a special price, or private treaty with shares.

Solid foals are concided breeding stock only. I DO NOT believe in CPO. I DO NOT out-cross. I believe the Appaloosa Horse is a BREED WITH COLOR PATTERN and I will not compromise! Although you will find a few of my mares carry QH blood, it is not by choice but because of the hardship of finding pure-bred Appaloosas in this part of the country, so if the mare can produce good babies with Spots, she may stay.

Wild Wish Farm's extended goal is to produce leopard spotted foals that can be registered in both the Appaloosa Horse Club and The American Leopard Horse Club, and to be able to reproduce leopard color generation after generation. I believe the TRUE spotted horse originated in Steppes or Don region of Russia, with the Leopard Horse, as researched by Frank Scriptor. I am dedicating my breeding program to the breeding back of the true spotted horse, The Leopard.

So hop up here behind me on a true spotted back and with luck, maybe you will SPOT YOUR FOAL at Wild Wish Farm!

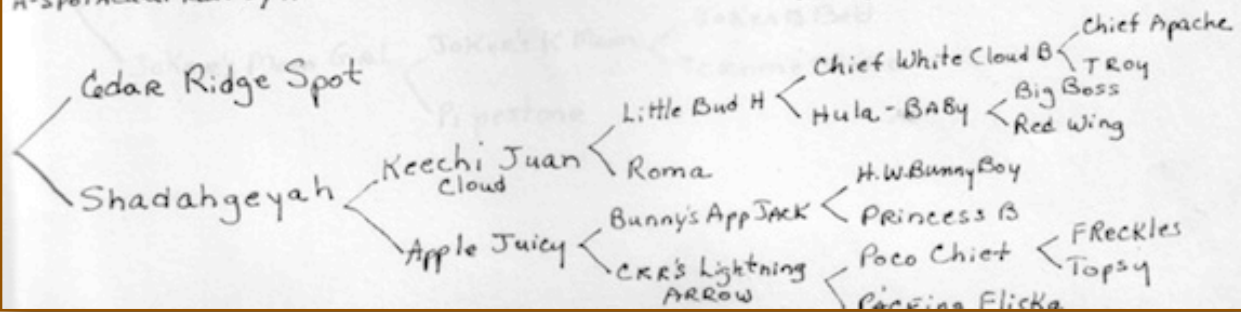

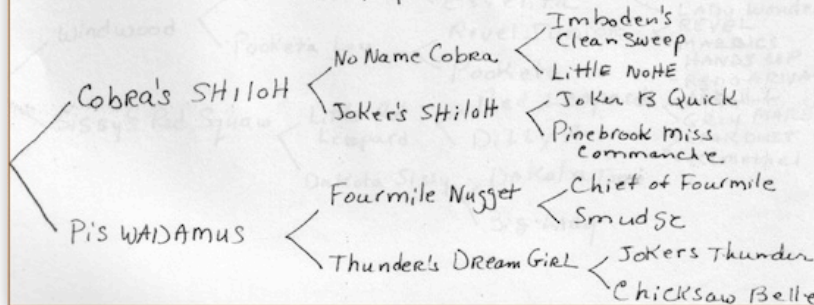
